

# Religion

## Fifth Grade

### Program Goal:

The learner will study the Catholic faith and be able to apply these beliefs in their actions through various service, prayer, and decision making opportunities.

### Grade Level Goal:

The learners will examine their Catholic faith through the seven sacraments as they learn to live their faith and apply it within their lives.

### Content Criteria:

#### I. Beliefs

- The learner will describe a Christian as one who knows, loves, and serves God.
- The learner will analyze Jesus as both divine and human as described in the Gospels.
- The learner will describe how a covenant is a promise of love and partnership.
- The learner will compare and contrast the Gospel writings of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.
- The learner will describe how Gospel readings about Jesus' life apply to us.
- The learner will describe the characteristics of the Church.
- The learner will understand that the sacraments provide us with God's healing and nourishment.
- The learner will define what a sacrament is.
- The learner will classify the seven sacraments.

## II. Actions

- The learner will demonstrate that the newly baptized are free from sin and are given new life in Christ.
- The learner will understand that receiving Jesus Christ in Holy Communion will help us to love and serve others.
- The learner will receive forgiveness from God through reconciliation to grow and act in a Christian manner.
- The learner will work to protect life and promote love of neighbor.

## III. Worship

- The learner will describe Baptism as a sacrament that gives new life, cleanses sin, and joins us to the Christian community.
- The learner will describe Confirmation as a sacrament that strengthens us through the Holy Spirit.
- The learner will describe the Eucharist as a sacrament in which Christ is really present in us.
- The learner will describe Penance/Reconciliation as a sacrament that celebrates God's forgiveness which reunites us with God and the Church.
- The learner will describe the sacrament of Anointing of the Sick as a celebration of Christ's healing presence in our lives.
- The learner will describe Marriage as a sacrament that celebrates the grace-filled covenant between a man and a woman.
- The learner will describe the sacraments of Holy Orders as one that celebrates the call to serve God's people through the ordained ministry.
- The learner will explain how the sacraments relate to the faith journey and the personal life experiences of a fifth grader.

## **IV. Prayer**

- The learner will demonstrate reverence during prayer and liturgy.
- The learner will incorporate formal and informal prayer to express personal and communal spirituality.
- The learner will recite the Rosary on a daily basis during the months of October and May.

### **Instructional Criteria:**

- The learner will incorporate sacramentals, symbols, and rituals into meaningful prayer experiences and liturgies.
- The learner will incorporate various religious vocabulary words when appropriate.
- The learner will participate in daily classroom discussions about his/her faith.
- The learner will have various opportunities to explore the Bible.
- The learner will participate appropriately in liturgies.
- The learner will plan and participate in various service projects.
- The learner will cooperate in school, parish, and community activities.
- The learner will describe how the church celebrates liturgical feasts and seasons through the liturgical calendar.
- The learner will pray daily; to talk to God and to listen to God's will.
